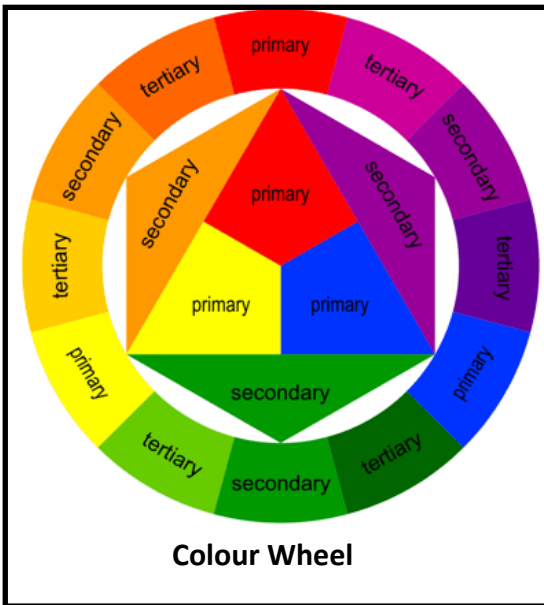




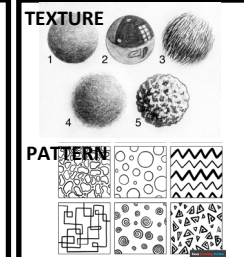
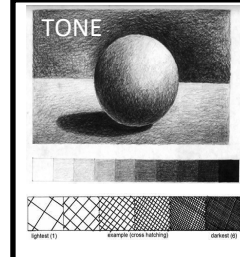

Key Vocabulary

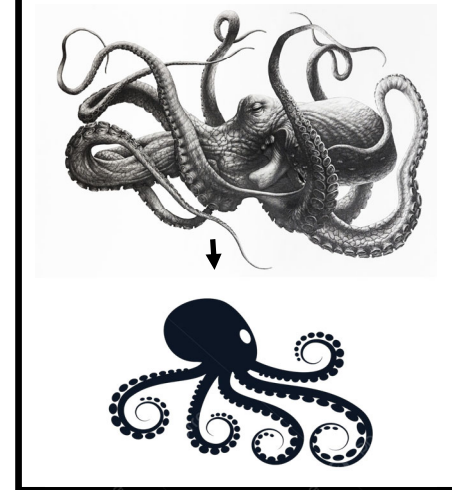
- Proportion** The size of a part of something when compared to the whole/rest of it
- Structure** The manner in which something is built, arranged, or organized
- Stylisation** To re-design and change the appearance of an object, often making it less realistic.
- Form** The 3D shape of something, its visual appearance, the way it is structured, or put together
- Tone** The lightness or darkness of something – this could be a shade, or how dark or light a colour appears.
- Analyse** To examine carefully in detail, separating things out in order to understand or make sense of something
- Interpretation** To explain something or give it meaning

Sculpture– the art of making 3 dimensional forms (3D)
Weight, balance, structure, form

To re design and change the appearance of an object

Media and Process

- Experimentation** The act of testing or trailing out something in order to learn or discover
- Media** The materials you use to make ART that enable you to communicate ideas and images (eg paint, collage, clay)
- Process** Step by step actions or tasks that build towards and end outcome
- Technique** A practical way or method of making

Oil Pastel

Blend– merge together, combine

Texture– the feel or appearance of a surface (eg furry, bumpy, smooth)

Sgraffito– decoration made by scratching through to another layer of colour

Printmaking

Repeat pattern– when a design or motif repeats and expands

Negative space– the space, gaps or shapes that appear around, or in between the main objects

Collage

Collage– to stick or glue down

Found images– images found that were not intended to be art– eg images found in magazines, photos, newspapers

Juxtaposition– placing 2 images together that contrast, to create an interesting effect or reaction

Surrealism– an art movement that began around 1920 - a style in art and literature in which ideas, images, and objects are combined in a strange way, like in a dream.

- Disturbing
- Humorous
- Unexpected
